<p>Expected Progress:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 96.7% of pupils entitled to Pupil Premium made expected or better than expected progress in mathematics. • 96.7% of pupils entitled to Pupil Premium made expected or better than expected progress in reading. • 93.5% of pupils entitled to Pupil Premium made expected or better than expected progress in writing. <p>Age Related Expectations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 74.2% of pupils entitled to Pupil Premium are working at ARE or above in reading. • 93.5% of pupils entitled to Pupil Premium are working at ARE or above in writing. • 64.5% of pupils entitled to Pupil Premium are working at ARE or above in mathematics. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Several families benefiting from improved emotional well-being and behaviour of children. • Children enjoying a range of experiences beyond what school provides through the curriculum • Respite support from using After School Care • Higher quality resources for teaching and learning in literacy & numeracy • Children have access to more small group intervention time • More able children entitled to Pupil Premium have experienced more curriculum enrichment activities
