Nature of support 2012/13

Support for pupils was provided through the funding of:

- 0.5 Teaching Assistant to deliver specific interventions targeting reading, writing, maths, social skills
- 0.25 Teaching Assistant to support children experiencing emotional and behavioural difficulties
- 0.25 Teaching Assistant to support independence with health and self care, basic literacy and numeracy skills
- Year 5/6 booster sessions
- Staff training & development – Drawing and Talking Therapy, Assessment for learning, Marking and Feedback
- New Home/ School reading books
- Phonics resources
- Drama workshops & Theatre Company in school
- Development of peer reading
- Extended Schools Activities

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2012/13

To support pupils at Toft Hill Primary School all Pupil Premium funding was targeted at

- The main areas of the curriculum; Reading, Writing and Maths to raise attainment and improve rates of progress.
- To develop social skills, emotional well being and behaviour of pupils
- To increase access to a greater range of experiences

Measuring the impact of PPG spending

- Several families benefiting from improved emotional well being and behaviour of children.
- Children enjoying a range of experiences beyond what school provides through the curriculum
- Respite support from using After School Care
- Parents have reported how much more enthusiastic children are when reading new books at home
- Children experience more engaging phonics sessions
- Children have access to more small group interventions
- Children who require support to develop their emotional well being have accessed a Drawing and Talking therapy programme.
- More able children entitled to Pupil Premium have experienced more curriculum enrichment activities
- The vast majority of pupils entitled to Pupil Premium made expected or better than expected progress in reading, writing and mathematics.
- 100% of pupils passed Year 1 phonics screening check
