

Curriculum focus of PPG spending 2014/15

To support pupils at Toft Hill Primary School all PE funding was targeted at:

- To improve expertise and confidence of staff by providing appropriate training
- To fund employment of PE apprentice to help provide effective teaching of PE and curriculum support
- To raise profile of PE in the school and increase intra school competitions
- To fully resource all aspects of PE so that it can be taught effectively
- To fund transport for pupils to attend inter school competitions

£100	Competition entry fees	Costs to enter termly football league	Raise participation levels of pupils attending regular inter school competitions
£1000	Curriculum support for staff	Specialist PE teacher/coach to provide curriculum support	Increase staff expertise and confidence teaching PE
£1000	After school clubs	Coaches to provide after school club activities	To raise level of participation in out of school hours activities

Measuring the impact of PE spending

- 100% of upper Key Stage 2 pupils attended at least one Level 2 Sainsbury's School Games events. 13 pupils attended a Level 3 event.
- Accessed more festivals than the previous year.
- Raised the profile of PE in school with sports award and large corridor display.
- Increased participation at after school clubs. Over 75% of KS1 pupils attended at least 1 after school club with over 50% attending more than one club during the year.
- Teachers worked with PE specialists to create lesson plans and increased confidence with the delivery of the PE curriculum.
- Achieved Silver Level Sainsbury's School Games Award.
- Raised participation of targeted pupils via Change 4 Life club. Some of the targeted pupils went on to attend further after school clubs throughout the year.
- Engaged KS2 pupils in leading, managing and officiating Level 1 intra school sport.
